### From the Director

Forty years. Half a lifetime. A milestone. The beginning of a legacy, perhaps. A very happy anniversary that began in early 1974.

Nine hundred and ninety-three birds were banded that year at Woodland Dunes. Eight of those birds were recovered elsewhere. Three had lived- a sharp-shinned hawk caught at Cedar Grove, a rosebreasted grosbeak caught at Whitefish Bay, MI, and a red-tailed hawk found entangled in WI. The remaining birds-a flicker, woodcock, redtailed hawk, house sparrow, and ovenbird, were found dead or were shot within a year. Such are the perils birds face. All of them are long gone now, and we know nothing of the remaining 985. But what has happened to the place they were banded is remarkable.

The minutes of the first organizational meeting I can find from 1974, written by Lyn Brouchoud who is still our secretary, mention the name Woodland Dunes Wildlife Study Area. Bird observatory and nature center were two alternative descriptions mentioned. Some ambitious goals included preserving all forested land in Manitowoc County, and banding 25,000 bird annually, in addition to providing education programs.

Our forest thinks nothing of forty years. That community has survived for thousands. For most of that time the land took care of itself. Later, it took care of our community, feeding and housing and warming people, and it did so for more than a hundred years. Now, we take care of the land, and in return it feeds our souls, and those of the countless beings that share it with us.

Children, now old-timers, loved this place. They come back and visit, and talk fondly about how they would roam the forest and follow it's streams which held nicknames like the Nile River and Forget-Me-Not creek. The woods was large enough to justify a packed lunch to sustain an all-day outing. They shared the ridges and swales with grazing cattle, mink ranches, and egg farms, but still found the wilderness they needed in the ferns and frogs and bunchberries. One had tears in his eyes when he expressed his gratitude that it had been preserved.

The spirit of those children still lives here- a desire for exploration rather than consumption. Bernie shared that curiosity, and revealed the spirit to us through his interest in birds. It turned out that spirit resided in thousands of us, who together have made this place possible and have sustained it for forty years.

As we celebrate our forty years, remember what's important. Every plant, animal, and person of Woodland Dunes is a part of the same community, and we're all needed to sustain each other.



### **NEW Bird Observatory**

We are excited that work has begun on the new bird observatory at our headquarters. The addition will be twelve feet wide and four feet deep with plenty of window space (which will be bird-safe) overlooking our bird feeding area. If funding permits, we will add a second video camera that can be accessed from our website when the ospreys aren't on their nest.

The project is in memory of Esther Johnson and Jean Olson and is made possible through the generous contributions of Jack and Laurel and Fred and Charlotte Alyea. The foundation has been installed, and the remainder of the project will begin after Thanksgiving. We plan to use the observatory for our Christmas Bird Count for Kids in late December, and have a grand opening in January.

### Exploring the Landscape: A New Program Series for Families

With generous support from the Wisconsin Environmental Education Board (WEEB), the series will offer families with young children the opportunity to explore nature through the four seasons. It will also highlight the resources that are available in the Little Wings room and outdoor natural play area at Woodland Dunes. Each program will be designed to engage the children and the caregivers, so parents can share in their child's wonder of the natural world. Caregivers, be ready to participate and play! Activities will change with each season and families will be sent home with information on the activities they participated in that day, as well as other ideas they can do on their own.

Why get outside with your young children? Children who play outside are more likely to care about the environment when they are adults. Also, research strongly suggests kids need connections with nature as a regular part of their healthy growth and development.

It's been an exciting year for land management. We secured a grant from the DNR to treat Phragmites on the West Twin River and East Twin River, up to the first dam, over 5 years. This year was an exceptionally good year as far as weather and water level for treatment, and we treated approximately 10 acres of Phragmites.

Although we had approximately 30 acres mapped, most stands were so dense that the middle could not be reached and will be treated in following years. We also received grant money through Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP) to treat Phragmites on the Manitowoc River (1.25 acres) and at the Manitowoc County Recycling Center on County Road R (0.25 acres). Grant money through LNRP also allowed us to treat Japanese Knotweed along the West Twin River in Shoto.

Follow up treatment will be needed at all the sites for two to three years, and we have the funding to do it. It is important to partner with our neighbors and help them with invasive species management when possible, as these can act as source populations for our preserve as well.

Through other grants from US Fish and Wildlife Service, the West Foundation, WI Department of Administration's Coastal Management program, and many other partners, we (along with many volunteers) were able to plant over 2,500 native trees and shrubs this year. These replaced invasive trees and shrubs we removed with help from approximately 200 volunteers. This effort is part of a larger initiative called Restore the Shore. This project is aimed at removing invasive species and replacing them with native species which are beneficial to migratory song birds and other wildlife.

We look forward to continuing these efforts in 2015.
